

### Historian Report

#### Historian's Report: Teddy Roosevelt forms the Rough Riders

This month in 1898, Teddy Roosevelt resigned as Assistant Secretary of the Navy to organize the 2<sup>nd</sup> Squadron, 1<sup>st</sup> U.S. Volunteer Calvary, which became better known as the Rough Riders.

The unit was part of the mobilization for the Spanish American War. That war grew out of tensions between the U.S. and Spain largely over the latter's colonization of Cuba. Matters came to a head when the USS Maine blew up in Havana harbor. War was declared in April 1898 after the U.S. blamed Spain for the explosion.

With war declared, Roosevelt envisioned organizing a volunteer regiment made up frontiersman from the southwest but his reputation instead attracted a group of Ivy League athletes, glee club singers, polo players and hunters. Originally led by Colonel Leonard Wood, Roosevelt assumed command after Wood's promotion.

The Rough Riders left for Cuba in June 1898. However, despite their name, they deployed without horses, except for Roosevelt's mount, Texas. Later that month the horseless Rough Riders fought the Battle of Las Guasimas and recorded a victory. Roosevelt reportedly narrowly avoided several bullets as he led his troops in a flanking movement that forced the Spanish troops to flee.

The Rough Riders are best known for the later battle of San Juan Hill that occurred on July 1. Roosevelt had what he termed "the great day of my life," leading a series of charges and urging his men upward until the U.S. flag was raised over San Juan Heights.

Shortly after that battle, fighting ended as the Spanish fleet sailed from Cuba and an armistice was declared. The four-month conflict officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Paris in December of 1898. Under the treaty's terms, the U.S. assumed sovereignty of Puerto Rico, Guam and the Philippine Islands as well as other territory.

The experience with the Rough Riders greatly enhanced Roosevelt's reputation and led to his election to the U.S. Presidency three years later. Because of his exploits with the Rough Riders, he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor on January 16, 2001. The citation described his "conspicuous gallantry," specifically his leadership of charges up San Juan Hill despite heavy enemy fire.

Roosevelt's experience with the Rough Riders typified a life of adventure and courage. Another example is described in the book, *River of Doubt, by Joyce Millard, an account of his troubled exploratory expedition in Brazil. Bravery apparently was part of the Roosevelt genes. His son, Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., was the only general to land with the first wave of troops at Normandy on D-Day and grandson, Quentin was in the first wave at Omaha Beach. Theodore, Jr., who helped found the American Legion, was awarded the Medal of Honor in1944.*

### The VA's "Math": Calculating a Combined Rating

If you are receiving VA benefits for more than one disability and don't understand your cumulative rating, you are probably not alone. It is not exactly straight forward.

Here is what I'm talking about:

If you have been given a 20% and 40% disability rating, you would expect the cumulative rating to be 60%. Wrong!!! The "VA Math" is explained below.

### VA Math for Combined Ratings

Combined rating is the rating that the VA uses to determine compensation payments and access to other benefits when there are two or more disabilities.
Combined rating, NOT an accumulative or added rating. (*That's why 50% + 50% doesn't equal 100%.*)

• Combined rating starts with the highest rate and then what is left of the percentage, the final % is rounded to the nearest 10%.

**Example** Joe Veteran has a disability for PTSD at 30% then is awarded other ratings. back injury for a 20% rating left knee injury 10% and then a right knee injury 10%. 30+20+10+10=70% *Well NO not with VA math!* 

100% X 30% = 30% 70% is New Efficiency Rating70% X 20% = 14% 56% New Efficiency Rating56% X10% = 6% 50% New Efficiency Rating50% X 10% = 5% 45% New Efficiency RatingRounded to 40% New Efficiency Rating= 60% New Combined Rating

### **Burial Allowance**

As a reminder to our membership, once a veteran has passed, another important aspect of our government's "Allowed Benefits" comes into play for which the veterans family must apply. These benefits (burial and plot costs) are offered to help cover some burial costs. The Veterans Family/NOK (Next of Kin) must apply for these allowances. Use the link for description and steps to request benefits up to 2 years after death of your veteran.

The items for verification which the family/NOK must provide are:

DD-214 and Death Certificate.

Receipts of expenditures paid.

Statement of Account (preferably with the letterhead of the funeral director or cemetery owner)

It is imperative that you, the VFW/AL veteran, provide this information to someone in your family to apply for these benefits. Our government has a 2 year limit, **from date of death**, for these allowances to be paid to the deceased veterans family/estate.

If the veteran is to be buried at Abe Lincoln National Cemetery, or any other national cemetery, review their requirements at:
