



Healing Fields Memories



Historian Report

Our country's history contains many events that are sources of pride. There are others, however, that are more ignominious.

The Wounded Knee Massacre is solidly in the latter category.

The confrontation between Lakota tribe members and the U.S. Army took place on December 29, 1890, and followed decades of tensions between Indigenous People of the Great Plains and white settlers who relentlessly pushed westward.

These tensions intensified in the late 19th Century as the U.S. government repeatedly reneged on agreements to grant Native Americans ownership of sizeable tracts of land. For example, the Treaty of Fort Laramie in 1868 established a 60-million acre reservation for the Lakotas. Over the years, however, the government shrank the area in a series of moves that ended with the original area down to less than 13 million acres of about 20 percent of the original allotment.

Resentment by Plains Indians over the loss of territory grew and intensified with the development of a religious movement known as the Ghost Dance. Among the elements of this creed was the belief that the Creator would return the earth to its condition before the arrival of European settlers. Ghost Dance adherents also believed that they would be protected from bullets if they wore "ghost shirts." These were white garments decorated with various symbols supposedly lending protection to the wearers.

The territorial implications of the Ghost Dance caused anxiety and government agents and they sought to reduce its influence and potential to inspire resistance among Native Americans. Just prior to Wounded Knee, a large deployment of federal troops arrived in the vicinity. There they confronted Sitting Bull, the leader of the 1876 victory at the Little Bighorn. Although not himself a Ghost Dance adherent, the Indian leader resisted government efforts to repress the movement.

Against this backdrop, the U.S. 7th Cavalry became apprehensive over the movement of some 350 Sioux people from their reservation to the Pine Ridge reservation. The Cavalry commander ordered his soldiers to confiscate all the weapon held by the band and escort them to prison. As the troops carried out this order and were searching for hidden weapons, they attempted to disarm a deaf warrior who did not understand their intent. While some confusion exists, it is believed that his weapon accidentally discharged setting off an attack by the 7th Cavalry troops.

Although there is disagreement over the sequence of events and accounts of the conflict differ, there is no disputing the result: some 350 Native Americans – most of whom were previously disarmed – and including many women and children were killed.

Although the government initially described the confrontation as a battle, eyewitness accounts and later investigations established Wounded Knee as a massacre.

We have many reasons to be proud of our country. It's also responsible to acknowledge that our government has sometimes erred and took part in regrettable actions such as Wounded Knee.

Veterans Day Dinner

Here is the point of this little note. If you are on the fence about filing for VA benefits because you think you do not deserve them, come to the post and talk to us about it. We can help you make a sound decision. Some times there are gray areas that can be clarified. Remember getting what you are entitled is the right thing to do...
